<b>Risk</b> of injury – slips, trips, areas of active work	2	2	4	Garden inspected before opening to the public and any findings reported or repaired or roped off. Warn group to take care in areas when grass or paths are wet & choose suitable locations for active games.  Always keep an eye on your groups.  Never cross any form of barrier.	2	1	2	
<b>Risk</b> of injury, eg tripping, on cables and lighting	2	2	4	There may be extra vehicles and cabling and lighting laid in areas of the garden for events. Take care and avoid these areas in activities. Never cross any form of barrier.	2	1	2

Animal stings/bites								
<b>Risk</b> of sting leading to anaphylactic shock	3	1	3	Group leaders are responsible for managing any known allergies in young people, for bringing appropriate medication and ability to administer it.	3	1	3	



Risk of sting or animal bite leading to minor injury or infection	1	2	2	Warn group not to try to touch wild animals/birds. Guide children to be calm around stinging insects.	1	1	1	
<b>Risk</b> of tick bite leading to infection (Lyme disease)	3	2	6	Group leaders are aware what ticks look like and how to remove safely using tick twister/card. At peak tick times avoid using wilder areas if possible. Before activity in longer grass/ferns/wilder areas warn group to tuck trousers into socks.  Post activity - Visually look at clothing for ticks and brush off with hands. Tell children to ask parents to check for ticks afterwards. If ticks are present shake clothing outdoors and put into washing machine or into a bag. Be vigilant on skin for the next 24 hours as ticks can make their way around the body slowly and make a bite later. If you are bitten follow advice on NHS website.	3	1	3	Tick bite removal kits supplied in RBGE First Aid kits.
Injuries from plants								
Risk of injury by plant spines, twigs or similar	1	2	2	Be aware that some plants have spines and take care when touching. Be careful with eyes nears twigs and spines at eye level.	1	1	1	
Risk of poisoning/stomach after eating plant or fungi material	3	2	6	Warn children not to eat any plants. Contact emergency number for first aid advice if you think a member of your group has ingested plant material in the garden.	3	1	3

Sun Risk of heat stroke	3	1	3	Find shade as much as possible on very hot days. Come prepared with suitable outdoor clothing, e.g., hats & bring bottles of water.	2	1	2

Rain & Cold Risk of hypothermia	1	1	1	Come prepared with suitable footwear and outdoor gear.	1	1	1

If high winds are forecast phone for advice in advance of your visit:  Benmore 01369 706261  Visitors on site will be alerted by staff of safe route and asked to leave the garden.  Respect signs and barriers and follow suggested alternative routes in garden.	3	1	3	
<b>Risk</b> of being injured by lightning strikes	3	2	6	If electrical storms are forecast Garden staff will make decision on whether to shut the garden. Your visit may be cancelled in advance or cut short if necessary.	3	1	3	If caught in a storm follow advice by Met Office. Seek shelter. Avoid water and find a low-lying position away from trees, poles and metal objects.

Plants Risk of allergic reaction (dermatitis or similar)	1	2	2	Plant diversity prevents any absolute guarantee of a person not encountering an unknown skin allergen. If a known skin allergy exists take care.  Wash hands after touching anything in nature.  Get advice from healthcare specialist if a rash appears after being in the garden.	1	2	2	
Machinery								
<b>Risk</b> of injury from tractors & trailers and vehicles on the paths	3	2	6	Warn group that we operate moving vehicles on main paths in the garden. Some are quiet electric vehicles, and you may not hear them approach. Take care when crossing and be vigilant when walking.  Give clear boundaries when playing games on lawns and directions not to run onto paths.  Move on to grass to allow vehicles to pass.  Warn children not to run out from Discovery centre as garden vehicles may be using the internal road.  Take care when entering the Garden from car park and cross public road safely.	3	1	3	Drivers stick to speed limit & are vigilant around groups.



Risk - Injury from falling down cattle grid	3	2	6	Warn children to use the path and not to walk over the cattle grid.	3	1	3	
Risk of injury from lawnmowers	3	1	3	Lawnmowers operate on lawn areas. Be vigilant and move away to another area if necessary. Do not chase mowers or other machinery.	3	1	3	Operators are vigilant around groups.

<b>Risk</b> from visitors	3	1	3	If you suspect any suspicious activity by a visitor phone number above to report or call 999 direct for police in emergencies. Gather your group and make your way to a more public area with other people present. Make your way back to teaching space or staffed area ASAP.	3	1	3	Staff are vigilant

Risk of injury from unsafe shelters	1	2	2	Staff carry out safety checks on all shelters. If guy ropes are present, they will have visual hazard warning, eg ribbon/tape.	1	1	1	
Risk of injury in indoor spaces	1	2	2	Ask group to take care and walk inside buildings. Staff will ensure groups are alerted to any risk inside teaching spaces if they are taking part in a programme with the Learning Team.	1	1	1
